1. Author's name (last name, initials)

5. Volume number in italics

6. Page numbers

7. Home page or DOI

3 Full title of the document, or article or poem, etc

4 Title of the entire Internet site (in italics)

5 Name of institution or organization that sponsors the site if not cited earlier

6 URL (complete address for specific document or Internet Site. If necessary, break URL only after a slash).
